

## HS symptom checklist

## **Purpose**

HS is diagnosed through clinical observation and symptom history, see the diagnostic flowchart for more information. However, HS goes further than the skin, affecting all aspects of patients' lives.

This checklist illustrates the range of symptoms that your patients may experience, so that you can holistically assess your patients and initiate appropriate management to address all aspects of HS to improve overall quality of life.
